The purpose of conducting the hearing is to establish a sewer district and to hear all persons interested.

The proposed sewer district is to serve the Hamlet of South Kortright. The boundaries were discussed and a map was on display and is on file at the Town Clerk's Office.

The improvements proposed to be made are: construction of a sewage collection system that includes modifications to the Allen Residential Center pump station and the village of Hobart Wastewater Treatment Plant and completion of a Stormwater Retrofit Program that serves the residents within the sewer district. The Engineer's Report and Plan are on file with the Town Clerk.

The costs of forming the district and designing, permitting and construction the infrastructure are funded by New York City pursuant to the Community Wastewater Management Program. The Town will not incur any expense in the formation of the proposed district and the construction of the public improvements (sewer collection system) to be constructed within the district. During the process to form the Sewer District, the Town Board reserves the right to modify the boundaries of the proposed district to address the concerns raised during the public comment period and to serve the best interest of the Town.

A detailed explanation of the annual operation and maintenance costs to residential and non-residential users is on file with the Town Clerk.

Maps were reviewed and questions were answered.

Supv. Triolo asked the attendees if the town should move forward and if the town board should adopt a resolution at the next town board meeting to establish a sewer district. All attendees present agreed to the establishment of a sewer district.
