RESOLUTION NO. 16-2009 was introduced by Rudy Stripp and seconded by Michael Triolo:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that we adopt the following:

TITLE: ADOPTION OF THE WEST BRANCH DELAWARE RIVER STREAM CORRIDOR MANAGEMENT PLAN

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Soil and Water Conservation District (DCSWCD) and New York City Department of Environmental Protection (NYCDEP) have worked closely with a local Project Advisory Committee, the Town of Stamford and other watershed stakeholders to develop the West Branch Delaware River (WBDR) Stream Corridor Management Plan (SCMP) which takes a science based, long term management approach to the streams in the basin; and

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Board of Supervisors declared lead agency for the adoption of both plans and coordinated the environmental review with the other involved agencies, towns, and villages as a Type 1 action under 6 NYCRR Part 617 of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA); and

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Board of Supervisors issued a negative declaration under SEQRA for the adoption of the WBDR SCMP, Resolution No. 206, on October 22nd, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the Delaware County Board of Supervisors have adopted the WBDR SCMP by Resolution No. 207, on October 22nd, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the WBDR SCMP addresses water quality and economic vitality issues as defined by local communities and regional experts; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Stamford has adopted and supports the goals of the Delaware County Action Plan for water resource protection; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Stamford has adopted and supports the goals of the Delaware County All-Hazards Mitigation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the DCSWCD and the Town of Stamford recognize that the WBDR and its tributaries are a key element of the identity of the Cannonsville Reservoir watershed; and

WHEREAS, the DCSWCD and the Town of Stamford have worked cooperatively on stream management issues relevant to both public and private interests; and

WHEREAS, the DCSWCD and the Town of Stamford desire to work cooperatively to implement the WBDR SCMP for the common benefit of both parties, protection of the natural resources and the interests of the broader watershed stakeholders;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Town of Stamford recognizes, and adopts the West Branch Delaware River Stream Corridor Management Plan as a guidance document that can assist the Town and its landowners with addressing long term management of the West Branch watershed in a manner that is consistent with the protection of public and private property, the protection of natural resources, goals and strategies for water quality protection, and economic opportunities as defined in the plan, and in a way that will provide the Town of Stamford, its landowners and visitors with multiple benefits.

RESOLUTION NO. 17-2009 was introduced by Michael Triolo and seconded by Rudy Stripp:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that we agree to the following:

Memorandum of Understanding for Implementation of the West Branch Delaware River Stream Corridor Management Plan

This is an agreement between the following parties;

Party 1	Town of Stamford (the Town) 101 Maple Avenue PO Box M Hobart, NY 13788
Party 2	Delaware County Soil & Water Conservation District (DCSWCD) 44 West Street, Suite 1 Walton, NY 13856
Whereas,	The Town has adopted by resolution the WBDR SCMP; and
Whereas,	The WBDR SCMP is consistent with the attached <i>Statement of Stream</i> <i>Stewardship Principles</i> with which the Town, DCSWCD and Delaware Basin Project Advisory Committee agree; and
Whereas,	The DCSWCD and the Town desire to work cooperatively to implement the WBDR SCMP for the common benefit of both parties, protection of the natural resources and the interests of the broader watershed stakeholders; now
Therefore,	the Town and DCSWCD agree as follows,

1. Funding

This agreement is neither a fiscal nor a funds obligation document. The DCSWCD and Town mutually agree that execution of this MOU in no way obligates either party to fund, or automatically support activities that may be set forth in the MOU.

2. Purpose:

This agreement outlines the roles and responsibilities of both the DCSWCD and the Town for the purpose of implementing the WBDR Stream Corridor Management Plan (SCMP) and its recommendations, the Streamside Assistance Program, and/or projects funded by the Catskill Watershed Corporation Stream Corridor Protection Program. The parties agree that the implementation of this MOU will have mutual benefits.

3. Responsibilities of the DCSWCD

The DCSWCD, within the limitations of its funding and staffing resources, shall provide the Town, its residents, and other stakeholders, with technical, administrative, and project management assistance to carry out the goals and objectives of the WBDR SCMP. This assistance shall include, but is not limited to the following:

- a. Convening and administering the Project Advisory Committee and its subcommittees which will guide the overall implementation of the Stream Management Plan and its recommendations.
- b. Provide a copy of the most recent version of the WBDR SCMP to appropriate Town and/or County officials, to include the Town and County Highway Departments.
- c. Distribute the WBDR SCMP and Action Plan to the Delaware County Planning Department for distribution to planning and zoning boards, and code enforcement officers, where applicable, as a guide to implement the recommendations of the plan and access technical information available in the plan and available assistance through the DCSWCD.
- d. Attend meetings at the request of the Town, as time permits.
- e. Provide, within the limitations of available resources, DCSWCD technical staff and/or consultants to assist the Town, its landowners or other applicable stakeholders, with issues related to stream management. Examples of such assistance may include, but are not limited to;
 - Providing training and/or assistance to the Town's highway department on matters related to bridge design, culvert replacement, streambank erosion and repair, stormwater management, critical area vegetation, stream crossings, emergency flood response and other issues related to natural resources and the Town's highway system.
 - Provide training and/or technical assistance to the Town's Planning Board, in coordination with the County Planning Board and Planning Department, for matters related to; stream management, stormwater management, floodplain management and other issues related to natural resources that may be applicable to projects presented to the planning board for review and approval.
 - Provide training, guidance and technical support, in coordination with the Delaware County Planning, Public Works and Emergency Services Departments, and the NYC DEP, for flood preparation, response and recovery plans and activities.

- <u>Streamside Assistance Program</u>
 - Provide assistance through the newly organized Streamside Assistance Program to the Town's landowners.
- <u>Catskill Watershed Corporation Stream Corridor Protection Program</u>
 - Provide assistance to municipalities regarding project feasibility and conceptual design assistance.
- Assist the Town with securing regulatory permits for projects of mutual interest to the Town and DSCWCD.
- Assist the Town with developing / amending strategies, ordinances, and plans as may be appropriate to address issues related to stormwater management, stream management, wetland impacts, etc.
- Assist the Town and its stakeholders with identifying, securing, and managing funds from multiple sources as may be appropriate to further the implementation of the WBDR SCMP.

4. Responsibilities of the Town

The Town, within its limitations and authority, agrees to work cooperatively with the DCSWCD, its various programs, and other agencies and stakeholders that may be involved with the implementation of the WBDR SCMP. The Town's responsibilities shall include, but not be limited to:

- a. Adopt and agree to implement the WBDR SCMP.
- b. Appoint a primary and secondary point of contact as their representatives to the Project Advisory Committee, identifying individuals that will effectively represent the varied interests of the Town and its stakeholders.
- c. Utilize the WBDR SCMP as a guidance document for Town activities as they relate to the WBDR and its associated natural resources.
- d. Work cooperatively with the DCSWCD to identify, secure and manage funds from multiple sources as may be appropriate to meet the objectives set forth in the Action Plan and SCMP recommendations.

5. Term

The term of this MOU shall be in effect for a period for five (5) years, coinciding with the DCSWCD contract with the New York City Department of Environmental Protection,

effective September 1, 2008. The agreement is renewable in five (5) year increments by resolution and written notification by each party prior to the expiration of the agreement.

6. Amendments

Amendments will be enacted upon consensus between the two parties to the proposed changes in writing.

7. Termination

This agreement can be terminated by either party, for any reason whatsoever, upon thirty (30) days written notice by the party seeking termination to the other party.

8. Limitations of Authority

Neither the DCSWCD nor the Town shall have any authority to enter into contracts in the name of the other, or to bind or obligate the other to any contractor, subcontractor or other third party, for any sum of money, or in any other way.
